**SEMINARS REPORT**

As part of the project, the 3 seminars as multiplier events were implemented in 2016. The objective of these event was to disseminate project results and information on innovative methods as peer-to-peer and coaching to a larger number of professionals from the social and psychological areas dealing with victims of human trafficking.

*The Seminar in Romania*, was organized by Association Pro Refugiu in Bucharest city on 20 May 2016. At the event attended 13 local stakeholders' representatives (institutions and non-governmental organizations having as common target group victims of human trafficking).



*The Seminar in Spain*, was organized by Association Trabe Iniciativas para la Economia Social y Solidaria in Madrid city on 10 June 2016. 47 local stakeholders attended.



*The Seminar in Czech Republic*, was organized by Caritas in Prague city on 30 June 2016, with the attendance of 17 local stakeholders' participants.



The Agenda for each seminar approached similar topics the purpose being to disseminate the similar information in all 3 countries:

- Presentation of Project Results and Outputs
- Coaching: what it is, the professional relation coach-coachee, how to develop a coaching sessions, the guide of conduct for a coach, communication strategies, methods of monitoring the progress of the coachee (child / youth victim of human trafficking).
- Peer-to-Peer: what it is, how to implement peer-to-peer session, how to support former victims of human trafficking to act as peers to newly identified victims, limitations and challenges in implementing this support method.

During the seminars, various learning methods were used as power point presentations, case studies, exercises, role plays.

Participants at seminars positively appreciated the information delivered especially on topics linked to coaching and peer to peer methods that can be used and adapt in their daily work to support victims of human trafficking as part of their rehabilitation process.
